

Javaid I. SHEIKH

Professor and Dean

Weill Cornell Medicine-Qatar (WCM-Q)

Dean Javaid SHEIKH is an internationally renowned medical executive, a distinguished clinician-scientist and a widely sought-after thought leader in global academic medicine.

Dean SHEIKH is Chief Academic Officer of the groundbreaking Weill Cornell Medicine in Qatar (WCM-Q), the first medical school based outside the United States to grant a fully US-accredited MD degree. Owing to the medical school's firm commitment to academic rigor and achievement, WCM-Q graduates have distinguished

themselves as worthy peers of the best and brightest of their US and global counterparts and are now part of a new generation of highly qualified physicians and physician-scientists serving the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region and the wider world.

In addition to playing a central role in shaping the innovative model of undergraduate medical education at WCM-Q, Dean SHEIKH also led efforts to build the college's academic center for translational and clinical research, the first of its kind in the MENA region. Under Dean SHEIKH's leadership, WCM-Q has attracted a critical mass of world-class educators, biomedical scientists and clinicians who are helping Qatar transition from a carbon-based economy to a diversified model founded upon knowledge, education and R&D, in accordance with the goals set out in Qatar National Vision 2030.

To support the ongoing professional development of healthcare practitioners in Qatar, Dean SHEIKH established a Division of Continuing Professional Development at WCM-Q, which recently became the first such program in the MENA region to receive accreditation from the US Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME). This important step is helping to ensure that healthcare professionals in Qatar reach and maintain the very highest standards of healthcare delivery for their patients. In recent years, Dean SHEIKH has also led the conceptualization and implementation of a series of comprehensive programs to advance health promotion and disease prevention for the general population of Qatar by cultivating healthy behaviors among all members of the community, with a particular focus on school-age children. Dean SHEIKH has also taken a leading role in designing and conducting population-based, longitudinal studies to assess the efficacy of these interventions.

A strong advocate of the utilization of new technologies and teaching methodologies in healthcare education, Dean SHEIKH co-founded 'Innovations in Global Health Professions Education' (IGHPE). Through an open-access journal, social media and a wide variety of digital content, this globally connected platform provides a forum in which educators and healthcare professionals from all over the world can share knowledge of conceptual and technological innovations in health professions education and explore avenues for productive collaboration. In addition to organizing annual international conferences on innovations in health professions education, which bring together some of the world's most dynamic thought leaders, IGHPE also convenes regional workshops to promote the dissemination of new ideas and concepts.

Prior to joining WCM-Q in 2007, Dean SHEIKH built a distinguished career as Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, Associate Dean and Chief of the Medical Staff and Chairman of the Board of the Palo Alto Institute for Research and Education at Stanford University School of Medicine and the Veterans Administration Palo Alto Health Care.

At Stanford, Dr. SHEIKH published the first studies exploring the impact of aging on anxiety disorders, while delineating differential sleep architecture in various anxiety disorders. His work was funded both by the National Institutes of Health and private sources and resulted in more than 150 scientific publications.



Victor DZAU

President

US National Academy of Medicine (NAM)

Victor J. DZAU, MD, is President of the US National Academy of Medicine. He is an internationally acclaimed leader and scientist whose work has improved healthcare in the United States and globally.

Under his direction, the National Academy of Medicine advances research and improves health by providing objective, evidence-based guidance on critical issues. His foresight in translation of research into diagnostic methods, medicines, and creative

solutions for human health issues is a great asset to the Academies and to the public at large. His own research laid the foundation for development of angiotensin-converting-enzyme (ACE) inhibitors, used globally to treat high blood pressure and congestive heart failure.

Prior to becoming President of the National Academy of Medicine, Dr. DZAU served as Chancellor for Health Affairs and President & CEO of Duke University Medical Center. He has received numerous awards including the Max Delbruck Medal from Humboldt University Charité and Max Planck Institute, the Gustav Nylin Medal from the Swedish Royal College of Medicine, the Polzer Prize from the European Academy of Sciences & Arts, the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, and the Distinguished Scientist Award of the American Heart Association.



Yang KE Executive Vice President Peking University (PKU)

Professor Yang KE is Executive Vice President of Peking University, a distinguished cancer researcher and a foreign associate of the National Academy of Medicine (Institute of Medicine).

Besides taking charge of the overall administration of Peking University Health Science Center (PUK-HSC) between 2004-2016 and devoting herself to the study of upper digestive tract malignant tumors, Professor KE is also a member or leader of many academic societies, boards and committees for cancer research, health

professions education and health system reform, both at home and abroad. She is also a member of the Editorial Board of Innovations in Global Health Professions Education (IGHPE).

Professor KE is a passionate champion of medical education reform, taking personal charge of the development of a new medical curriculum for PKU-HSC. Furthermore, she has lent her support and vision to promoting evidence-based clinical research, multidisciplinary cooperation, and internationalization in both research and education at PKU-HSC. She also plays an important role in motivating university-affiliated hospitals to actively participate in health system reform.

Dr. ARAYSSI's current research interests focus on rheumatoid arthritis, for which she has received funding as the Principal Investigator, and Behcet's disease. She has received several teaching awards and honors including induction to the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society and being highlighted as a woman leader in Residency Education by the Association of Program Directors in Internal Medicine (APDIM).

Dr. CRONE graduated from Albany Medical College and completed post-graduate training in pediatrics and anesthesiology at the Massachusetts General Hospital.

During his academic career he has served as founding Director of the ICU at Boston Children's Hospital, Professor & Chair of Anesthesia and Critical Care at Seattle Children's Hospital, as Medical Director at

Project HOPE, CEO of Harvard Medical International and Dean for International Programs at Harvard Medical School. Dr. CRONE has worked with the healthcare regulatory, assessment and accreditation communities in the US and internationally.

He has served as a consultant or as a member of the board of numerous US and international healthcare and educational institutions. In Qatar, as Vice Dean of Weill Cornell Medicine-Qatar, Dr. CRONE contributes to the development of the rapidly growing healthcare and medical education sector.

He was President of the Korean Society of Medical Education, the Association for Medical Education in the Western Pacific Region (AMEWPR), and the Korean Institute of Medical Education and Evaluation, the accrediting body of Korea. Currently he is Vice-President of the World Federation for Medical Education, Professor of Medical Humanities and Professor of the Department of Plastic Surgery.

Brownie is currently working with medical schools and government organizations in Brazil, Kazakhstan, and Vietnam. She is working in China to create a certification program for a new health professional: a health coach. She is also working with several medical schools and hospitals in Europe. Brownie is the editor of *Really Good Stuff* a bi-annual collection of reports of medical education innovations, published in the journal *Medical Education*, and she serves on the editorial board of *Academic Medicine*.

Brownie was on the faculty of the Arabian Gulf University for several years and has worked with the Foundation for Advancement of International Medical Education and Research (FAIMER).

He has been involved in teaching, research and consulting work at universities, consulting firms and government in the area of healthcare over twenty years in both the US and China. He has published extensively in the areas of health economics and health policy. He participated in the design, implement and evaluation of the first comprehensive healthcare reform plan (Massachusetts) in the US and was also actively involved in design of the new healthcare reform plan in China.

Prof. CAI was the cofounder of the Institute of Economic Development and Business School at the East China University of Science and Technology, Shanghai, and the first Chair of Department of Public Economics at Fudan University. He has received the 1990 Sun Yie-fang National Economic Science Prizes-Best Paper Award, the 2002 Most Outstanding Abstract Award by AcademyHealth in the US, and the 2009 Excellent Paper Award from the Shanghai Social Science Annual Conference. He received his PhD in Public Policy from the Heller School for Social Policy and Management at Brandeis University, Waltham, Massachusetts in 1997, his MA in Economics at Fudan University in 1984 and his BA in Economics at East China Normal University in 1982.




